Students may still graduate with the BHMS Counselling major if they do not attend classes or residential schools, however this may affect their eligibility for membership of PACFA Associations. All students in the counselling major are strongly encouraged to attend classes or residential schools for all CDS courses listed here as an integral part of their professional counsellor development and preparation.

Students must be eligible for a blue card or its equivalent from State and Territory jurisdictions in order to complete Human Services programs at USQ. Students seeking to undertake practicums must be officially authorized to work with children before they can be placed in a human service organization. See the Clinical Requirements section below

Students must have a Blue Card issued by the Commission of Children and Young People and Child Guardian in Queensland or its respective interstate equivalent to enrol in CDS2002 and CDS3000. These courses must be satisfactorily completed in order to graduate with a major in Counselling.

How to apply

Application for undergraduate programs

[Application for undergraduate programs](#) may be made through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC). The same procedure applies whether you plan to study on-campus or by distance education.

If you completed Year 12 at a Queensland secondary school you will be assessed for entry on the basis of your Overall Position (OP) or equivalent score. Year 12 students from other states or territories are considered for entry on the basis of their UAI, ENTER or TER and the subject prerequisites indicated. Other applicants will be based on their overall Rank.

Application for international students

This program is offered to international students. An international student is a person who is not an Australian or New Zealand citizen and not an Australian permanent resident. Please refer to [USQ International](#) for information about entry requirements, visa arrangements and how to apply.

Minor studies

Minor studies are designed to enable students to widen their knowledge and perspectives, or to complement their choice of major. Courses must be taken over two levels and should be in the same discipline or recognised multi-disciplinary area.

Within the Bachelor of Human Services, all students, except those undertaking a second major, must complete at least one four-course minor. Preference is given to a minor in Child and Family or Community Welfare and Development. Other minors may be chosen from within the Faculty of Arts or any other Faculty, as indicated in the [Minor studies](#) section of this Handbook. Enrolment requirements must be satisfied for any course selected.

For students intending to study the Psychology Minor: there is a requirement to select four courses that are not already included in the [BHMS](#) core or the chosen major.

Clinical requirements

Practical and/or clinical experience will be undertaken as part of the program. Students will negotiate supervised industry placement where they will have to demonstrate competency in those components of the course(s) which require application in a community or human services situation.

Students must have a Blue Card issued by the Commission of Children and Young People and Child Guardian in Queensland or its respective interstate equivalent to enrol in CDS2002 and CDS3000. These courses must be satisfactorily completed in order to graduate with a major in Counselling.

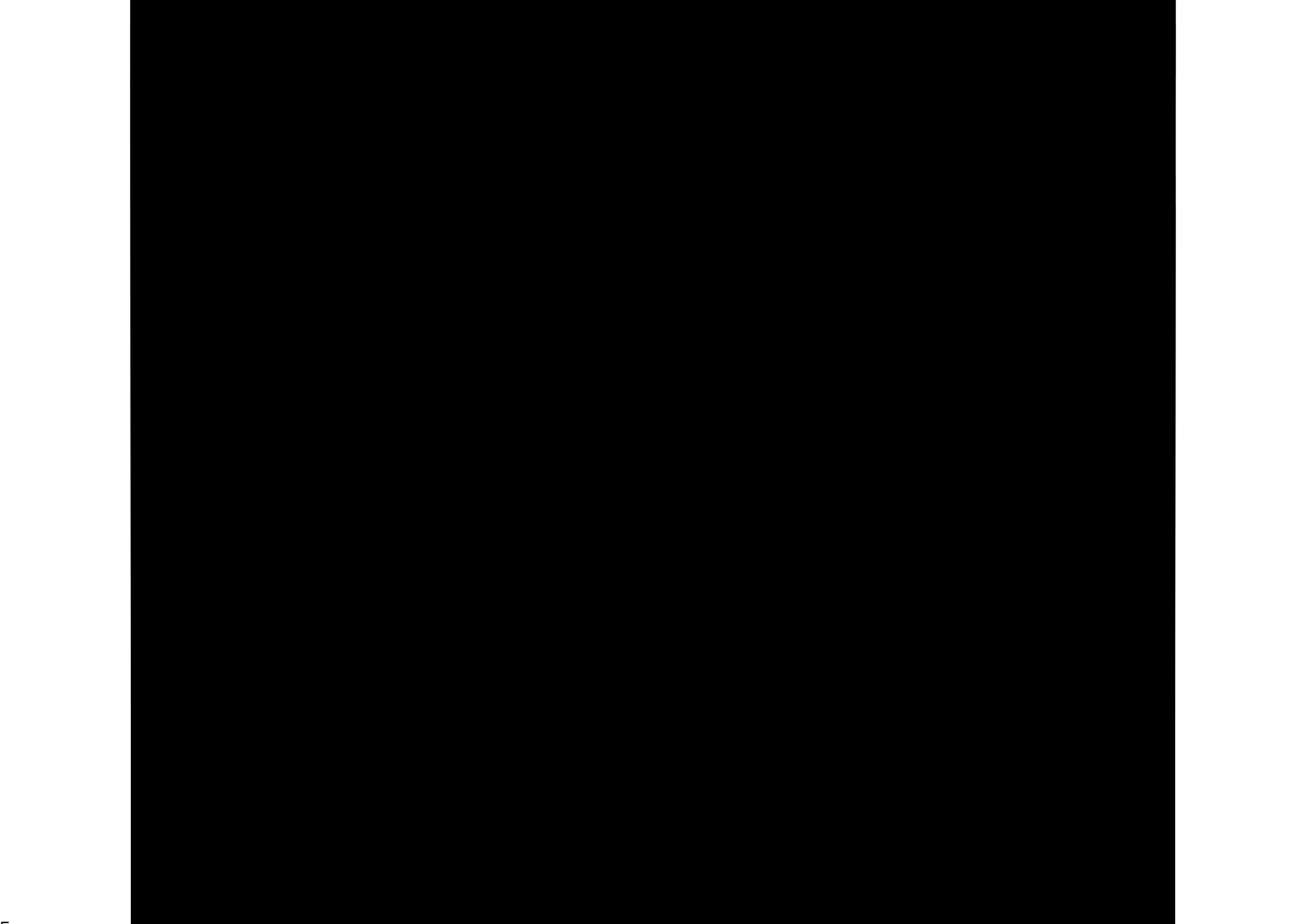
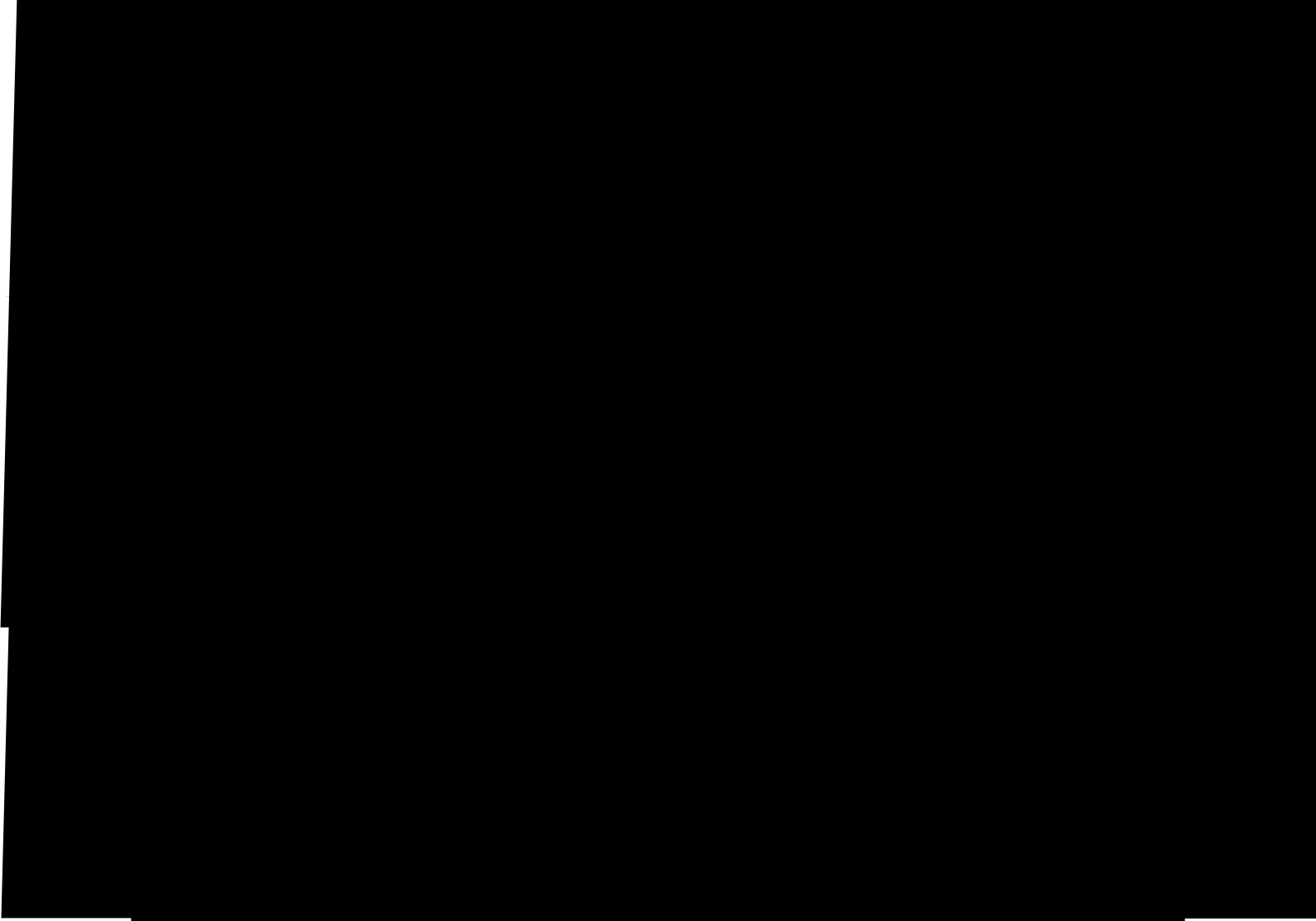
