Program structure

To be awarded a Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood) degree, a pre-service educator must have normally completed 32 units at undergraduate levels 1-4. At the discretion of the Faculty of Business, Education, Law and Arts, up to 4 units may be completed at postgraduate level.

Note: Minimum enrolment numbers apply to all courses. Should enrolments not meet the minimum number required, students may be transferred to a different mode or offering and advised of this change prior to semester start.

Duration: four years full-time equivalent study to a maximum duration of nine years.
