Graduate Diploma of Journalism (GDJN) - GradDipJnI This program is offered only to continuing students. No new admissions will be accepted. Students who

are interested in this study area should contact us.

Domestic full fee paying students may be eligible to defer their fees through a Government loan called FEE-HELP provided they meet the residency and citizenship requirements.

Australian citizens, Permanent Humanitarian Visa holders, Permanent Resident visa holders and New Zealand citizens who will be resident outside Australia for the duration of their program pay full tuition fees and are not eligible for FEE-Help.

International full fee paying place
