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Admission requirements

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A minimum of a recognised three-year bachelor degree (or equivalent) in a discipline other than education is required.

Applicants for the Primary pathway must demonstrate adequate coverage across the P-7 Key Learning Areas in their first degree or other studies. For assistance please refer to the Department of Education and Training Learning Areas. Applicants for Middle Years must demonstrate coverage across the Key Learning Areas and, in addition, discipline knowledge in two teaching areas. For assistance refer to the Queensland Studies Authority Guidelines. Secondary pathway applicants must demonstrate discipline knowledge in two defined teaching areas in their first degree or other studies. For assistance refer to Queensland Studies Authority Syllabus.

All applicants must show how their prior studies meet these requirements by submitting a completed Teaching Areas form with their application.

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International students must have completed the equivalent to Queensland secondary school Year 12 and be at university entry level standing.

Domestic and International Applicants from a non-English speaking background are required to satisfy English language requirements.

If you do not meet the English language requirements you may apply to study a University-approved English language program. On successful completion of the English language program, Applicants may be admitted to an Award Program.

Program completion requirements

Depending on whichever sector-based pathway is chosen, in order to complete the Graduate Diploma of Learning and Teaching, a student must complete 8 specified units of study. See the table below:

Professional experience All students, domestic and international, must complete the majority of supervised professional experience in Australian Primary and/or Secondary school settings.

Language Proficiency All students must demonstrate their English language proficiency by providing a recent IELTS test of 7.5 or higher (with no subset of less than 7.0 in any of the four skills areas, and a score of no less than 8 in speaking and listening), either on entry to or on graduation from the program.


