Admission requirements

Entry to the Bachelor of Laws (Honours) shall be by a [Bachelor of Laws](#) degree from the University of Southern Queensland or other recognised bachelor's degree in law from a recognised university with a pass at either:

- a credit level (grade point average of 5.0/7, that is 71.4 per cent) in the entire program and permission of the relevant Program Coordinator
- a grade point average of 5.2/7 (74.488gm557D.885 516.288 Tmdit le

Credit for completion of Practical Legal Training (PLT). Students may be eligible for credit of 4 units within the Bachelor of Laws (Honours) program on completion of an approved Practical Legal Training (PLT) program. As USQ does not offer a PLT program, students who wish to undertake this option are advised to contact an approved provider for program requirements and fees.
