All students are required to satisfy the applicable English language requirements.

If you do not meet the English language requirements you may apply to study a University-approved English language program. On successful completion of the English language program, you may be admitted to an award program.

Program fees

Domestic full fee paying place

Required time limits

IT requirements

Exit points

The exit point for students who do not complete the requirements of the MPRS Master of Professional Studies . is the GCPS Graduate Certificate of Professional Studies. Students will be eligible for this award if, whilst enrolled in the Master of Professional Studies ., they have completed at least 4 units including, WRP8000 Fundamentals of Professional Studies and two other units from the WRP courses in the student's approved Learning Plan.

Credit

The Learning Portfolio developed in WRP8000 Fundamentals of Professional Studies may be submitted for formal assessment of prior learning. Assessment of the Learning Portfolio is the only method of applying for consideration for credit for this program. The number of credits granted will vary according to both the level of formal qualifications gained and to the deemed level of informal experience and expertise that can be shown

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
