# **Admission requirements**

To be eligible for admission, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

- Have achieved a minimum Overall Position (OP) 18, tertiary entrance rank 61 or equivalent qualification.^
- Subject Pre-requisite: English (4, SA) or equivalent.
- English Language Proficiency requirements for Category 2.

Some majors or disciplines may require further pre-requisites.

Non-standard admission is in accordance with University of Southern Queensland regulations, especially articulation from TAFE, or successful completion of three approved units of the Tertiary Preparation Program

All students are required to satisfy the applicable English language requirements.

If students do not meet the English language requirements they may apply to study a University-approved English language program. On successful completion of the English language program, students may be admitted to an award program.

These are determined by the University for specific programs each Semester. The 2017 OP and tertiary entrance ranks are based on agreed QTAC schedules which assess formal study at Year 12 or equi

Students are required to complete 24 units as follows:

• All students must take the core course CMS1000 Communication and Scholarship in their first semester of study. Please note: students who have completed CMS1009 cannot enrol in CMS1000.



### Program completion requirements

For the purpose of these programs, majors/disciplines are grouped into nine categories - Humanities; Social Sciences; Biological Sciences; Psychology; Physical Sciences; Business; Engineering and Spatial Sciences; and Environment and Sustainability.

Students should indicate on their enrolment form which Major/Discipline is to be taken as their `first' discipline (six to eight units) or `second, third, fourth' discipline (three to five units). At the relevant question in the enrolment form students should list their Majors/Disciplines against the items First Major, Second Major, Third Major/Option, Second Option as appropriate. Ideally, students should indicate all four disciplines to be studied but, if these have not been decided, the first and second majors/disciplines should be indicated.

All students enrolled in this degree must contact the Faculty of Business, Education, Law and Arts before enrolling in any courses to ensure enrolment patterns are correct.
