Program structure

The Program entails four years of full-time study, during which time the student will complete 32 units, comprising compulsory psychology and statistics courses.

Requirements to Complete the Program

Admission into the 4th year of the program is contingent upon students having completed the first 3 years of the Bachelor of Psychology (Honours) program as well as maintaining an average Grade Point Average (GPA) of 5.0 in their psychology courses across levels 1 to 3. For students who fail to meet these requirements please refer to the Exit Point section.
