Program fees

Commonwealth supported place

A Commonwealth supported place is where the Australian Government makes a contribution towards the cost of a student's higher education and students pay a [student contribution amount](#) towards the courses undertaken. Commonwealth Supported students may be eligible to defer their fees through the [HECS-HELP](#) program.

Domestic full fee paying place

Domestic full fee paying places are funded entirely through the full payment of fees by students depending on the courses that are taken. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course using the [Course Fee Finder](#).

Domestic full fee paying students may be eligible to defer their fees through the [FEE-HELP](#) provided they meet the residency and citizenship requirements.

Australian citizens, Permanent Humanitarian Visa holders, and New Zealand citizens who will be resident outside Australia for the duration of their course are not eligible for [FEE-Help](#).

International full fee paying place

International students pay full fees. Full fees vary depending on the course. Students are studied on-campus, via distance education/online or a combination of on-campus and course via the [Course Fee Finder](#).

Students must maintain good standing in their program and comply with the [Academic and Exclusion Procedure](#).

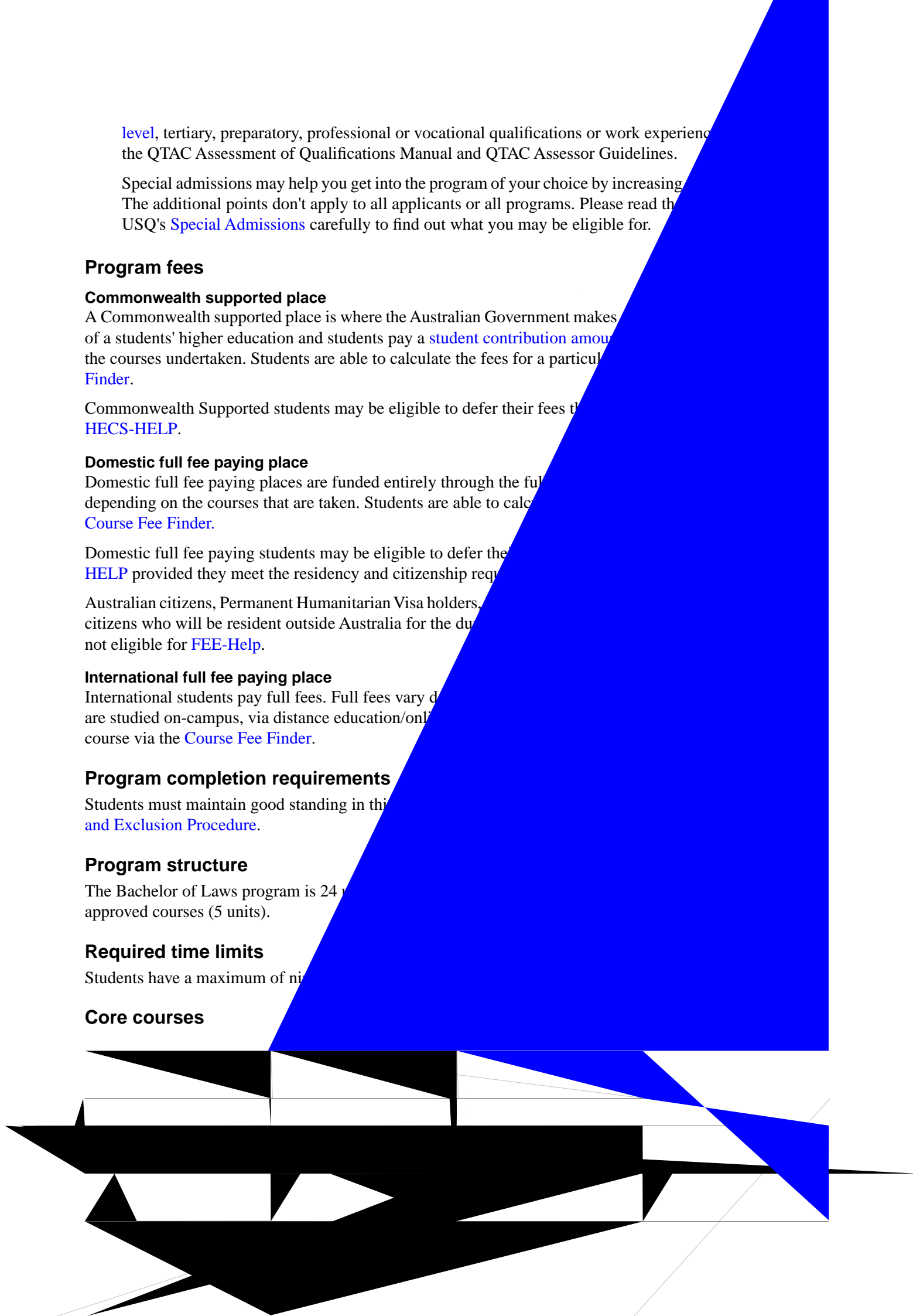
Program structure

The Bachelor of Laws program is 24 months of full-time study (120 credit points) over 6 semesters of approved courses (5 units).

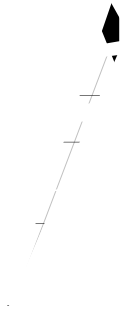
Required time limits
