Program fees

Commonwealth supported place

Students would however need to complete 2 additional Arts core courses, CSC1402 plus one core course from the list applicable to the [Bachelor of Arts](#).

Credit

Credit may be permitted for a limited number of courses, equivalent in content and level, successfully completed recently with a recognised institution, in accordance with USQ policy.
