#### **Australian Qualifications Framework**

# Admission requirements

To be eligible for admission, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

Completion of senior secondary schooling in the home country or equivalent, or Year 12 in an Australian high school.

Normally, to be eligible for enrolment in the program a person will have attained an age of at least 18 years in the year of the proposed enrolment.

Students will need to complete the online application form for entry to the program.

All students are required to satisfy the applicable English language requirements.

If students do not meet the English language requirements they may apply to study a University-approved English language program. On successful completion of the English language program, students may be admitted to an award program.

## **Program fees**

#### Commonwealth supported place

A Commonwealth supported place is where the Australian Government makes a contribution towards the cost of a students' higher education and students pay a student contribution amount, which varies depending on the courses undertaken. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course via the Course Fee Finder.

Commonwealth Supported students may be eligible to defer their fees through a Government loan called HECS-HELP.

#### Domestic full fee paying place

Domestic full fee paying places are funded entirely through the full fees paid by the student. Full fees vary depending on the courses that are taken. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course via the Course Fee Finder.

Domestic full fee paying students may be eligible to defer their fees through a Government loan called FEE-HELP provided they meet the residency and citizenship requirements.

Australian citizens, Permanent Humanitarian Visa holders, Permanent Resident visa holders and New Zealand citizens who will be resident outside Australia for the duration of their program pay full tuition fees and are not eligible for FEE-Help.

#### International full fee paying place

International students pay full fees. Full fees vary depending on the courses that are taken and whether they are studied on-campus, via distance education/online. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course via the Course Fee Finder.

# **Program structure**

This program consists of eight core courses as seen below. Students must first successfully complete the four core courses from the Certificate of English for University Studies (EUS1001, EUS1002, EUS1003, EUS1004). After that, students progress to complete the remaining four Diploma courses. All eight courses can be taken in a single academic year for those pursuing full-time studies.

#### **Core courses**

There are eight compulsory courses:

- EUS1001 Language for Study 1
- EUS1002 Listening and Speaking Fluently 1
- EUS1003 Reading and Critical Thinking 1
- EUS1004 Communicating Professionally 1
- EUS1005 Language for Study 2
- EUS1006 Listening and Speaking Fluently 2
- EUS1007 Reading and Critical Thinking 2
- EUS1008 Communicating Professionally 2

# **Program completion requirements**

To graduate with a Diploma of English for University Studies students must successfully complete the eight compulsory core courses.

# Required time limits

Students have a maximum of three years to complete this program.

## **Diploma of University Studies Recommended Enrolment Pattern**

Students are able to enrol in any offered mode of a course (on-campus, external or online), regardless of the program mode of study they enrolled in.

Students undertaking the Diploma of English for University Study must complete the four Level I, compulsory courses first. The recommended enrolment pattern is as follows:
