Program structure

The Graduate Certificate of Professional Studies is a four unit program consisting of:

- completion of the course WRP9012 Fundamentals of Professional Studies (2 units)
- completion of the course WRP9013 Professional Studies Research Project 2 (2 units).

To graduate from the Graduate Certificate of Professional Studies a candidate must complete four course units at USQ as stipulated in the Recommended Enrolment Pattern below.

Required time limits

Students have a maximum of 2 years to complete this program.

IT requirements
