Admission requirements

To be eligible for admission, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

- **Resident status**: students on international student visas or students from non-English speaking backgrounds resident in Australia
- **Minimum academic requirements**: completion of senior secondary schooling in the home country **or** Year 12 in an Australian High School **or** completed 'A' levels.
- English Language Entry Requirements:
 - EAP I An entry level of IELTS 5.0 or equivalent
 - EAP II (Undergraduate and coursework) An entry level of IELTS 5.5 or equivalent
 - EAP II (Postgraduate research) An entry level of IELTS 5.5 or equivalent

Program fees

Domestic full fee paying place

Domestic full fee paying places are funded entirely through the full fees paid by the student. Full fees vary depending on the courses that are taken. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course via the Course Fee Schedule

Domestic full fee paying students may be eligible to defer their fees through a Government loan called FEE-HELP provided they meet the residency and citizenship requirements.

Australian citizens, Permanent Humanitarian Visa holders, Permanent Resident visa holders and New Zealand citizens who will be resident outside Australia for the duration of their program pay full tuition fees and are not eligible for FEE-Help.

International full fee paying place

International students pay full fees. Full fees vary depending on the courses that are taken and whether they are studied on-campus, via distance education/online. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course via the Course Fee Schedules.

Fee exempt places

All domestic students are offered a fee-free place provided they meet the citizenship and residency requirements as follows:

Program completion requirements

USQ English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program completion requirements for articulation to USQ Undergraduate and Postgraduate degree programs.

Students wishing to apply for direct entry into undergraduate and postgraduate degree programs must meet the approved pathway and foundation program proficiency requirements. Students failing courses in EAPP English for Academic Purposes or not meeting the grades requirement for entry are required to retake those courses and seek recommendations from the Program Coordinator regarding a suitable pathway to gain entry to degree studies.

Required time limits

Standard duration of the on-campus program is a minimum of 10 weeks and a maximum of 60 weeks.

Normally, to be eligible for enrolment in the program a person will have attained an age of at least 18 years in the year of the proposed enrolment.

Students will need to complete the online application form for entry to the program.

All students are required to satisfy the applicable English language requirements.

If students do not meet the English language requirements they may apply to study a University-approved English language program. On successful completion of the English language program, students may be admitted to an award program.

Program fees

Commonwealth supported place

A Commonwealth supported place is where the Australian Government makes a contribution towards the cost of a students' higher education and students pay a student contribution amount, which varies depending on the courses undertaken. Students are able to calculate the fees for a particular course via the Course Fee Schedules.

Commonwealth Supported students may be eligible to defer their fees through a Government loan called HECS-HELP.

Domestic full fee paying place

Students have a maximum of two years to complete this program.



Program aims

The Diploma of English for University Studies aims to develop students' capacity to manage information, build knowledge and communicate ideas proficiently in English in both spoken and written forms, with a specific focus on enhancing academic English language skills to meet the more sophisticated communication demands of tertiary studies in particular professions. English language proficiency is benchmarked at Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE) 73 and the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) level C1+.

Program objectives

- (1) Develop students' capacity to prepare for and complete an internationally recognized test of proficiency in English language, at a level comparable to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) Level C1+, which meets requirements for future professional registration.
- (2) Develop students' capacity to comprehend and produce spoken texts clearly and appropriately in English at a near-native level for fluent and spontaneous professional dialogue.
- (3) Develop students' capacity to manage written information, think critically, and build knowledge in English at a near native-like level to meet the complex communication demands of tertiary studies for particular professions.
- (4) Develop students' capacity to communicate effectively in appropriate written and oral forms at a near native-like level of communicative competence which meets acceptable requirements for professional purposes and audiences.

Admission requirements

To be eligible for admission, applicants must satisfy the following requirements:

Completion of senior secondary schooling in the home country or equivalent, or Year 12 in an Australian high school.

Normally, to be eligible for enrolment in the program a person will have attained an age of at least 18 years in the year of the proposed enrolment.
